

# MONROE SWCD 2019 ANNUAL TREE & SEED SALE

## Blueberry (2): Reka and Blueray- \$18.00 per package

**Reka** is an early season variety bred in New Zealand, is one of the fastest growing and most adaptable varieties we have seen. A very vigorous variety, it grows well in light sandy soils, peat and heavier clay loams and is more tolerant to wetter ground than many other varieties. Reka ripens the season as Duke, but the berries have better flavor. Fruit is an attractive dark-blue color and the plant produces large crops.

**Blueray** is a mid season berry, harvesting later than Reka. Excellent choice for the home gardener. Bush is vigorous, productive, and winter hardy. Fruit is large, excellent eating, and freezing qualities.

## Wildlife Trees

### Common Apple(2)- 1 year seedlings, 18-24",bare root- \$5.00

Common Apple has edible fruit, great soft mast for whitetail deer. Trees can reach a height of 15' at maturity. Will adapt to a variety of soils, plant in full sun. Trees require cross pollination.

### American Plum (2)- 3-4" size, bare root- \$6.00

Classified as a shrubbery or small tree, known for its ability to spread in clumping form. Growth rate is moderate, can reach heights of 20'. Will adapt to coarse and medium texture soils. Blooms white in Spring, produces a fruit in late Summer/Fall, seed is red, edible, and a good food source for a variety of wildlife. Plant in full sun.

### Butternut (2)- 2-3' size, bare root- \$4.50

Known as the white walnut. Grows best on stream banks and well drained soil. Hard mast tree for wildlife. Growth rate is rapid, mature height can reach 80'. Plant in full sun.

### Black Walnut (2)- 2-3' in size, bare root- \$4.00

Growth rate is rapid, can reach heights of 35' in 20 years. Can reach 100' height at maturity. Plant in full sun, well drained soil, can tolerate fairly wet areas. Nut is a preferred food source by squirrels. Nut is also great for candy and cookie recipes. Valuable lumber product.

### Crabapple, Dolgo (2)- 1 year seedling 12-18", bare root- \$5.00

One of the all time Crabapple cultivars that whitetail deer prefer to eat. Tree blooms in Spring, color is soft pink to white. Plant in full sun, will adapt to a variety of soils.

Growth rate is medium, reaching mature height of 15-20'. Fruit is also excellent eating for a variety of recipes.

Nannyberry (2)- 2-3' size, bare root- \$5.00

Soft mast for a variety of wildlife, including a variety of bird species. Nannyberry is a shrubby, 12-16' in height, white showy bloom in Spring. Attracts birds and butterflies. Plant in full sun, will adapt to both medium and coarse soils.

Persimmon (2)- 3-4' size, bare root- \$6.50

Tree growth rate is considered slow, will adapt to a variety of soils. Mature height of tree is 55', plant in full sun. A known favorite fruit source of the whitetail deer.

Chinese Chestnut (2)- 18-24', bare root- \$4.00

Blight resistant. Plant at least two together for cross pollination. Growth rate is rapid, will reach heights of up to 50' at maturity. Plant in full sun, will adapt to medium and coarse soils. Growth habit tends to be multiple stem. Nuts are consumed by a large variety of wildlife.

## Fruit Trees

Apple Package 1 Each –Crimson Gold and Gold Rush \$28.00

Crimson Gold– Scab resistant cultivar, harvests 2nd week of September. Color is red orange blush on a yellow background, flesh is white, firm and juicy. Recommended Cultivar for Midwest Planting.

Gold Rush– Scab resistant cultivar, harvest time is early November. This apple is known for its storage qualities, fruit is crisp and tart, develops its sugars in storage. Good for baking and sauce. Recommended Cultivar for Midwest planting.

Peach Package 1 Each– FFury and Cresthaven \$26.00

FFury– Yellow flesh, fruit is very large, ripens in mid to late August. Tree blooms a little later making it more tolerant to frost damage.

Cresthaven– Very Firm, yellow flesh, highly colored variety for late season, harvests around late August. Fruit is freestone and the tree is also winter hardy.

Pear Package 1 Each—Bartlett and Golden Russet Bosc \$28.00

Bartlett- A large heavy bearing variety with excellent quality, long considered one of the best canning varieties. Ripens in late August.

Golden Russet Bosc– A good cross pollinator for Bartlett. Fruit is long and uniform in shape. Ripens in mid September.
